Pastor's Corner

Sunday, December 1<sup>st</sup> marks the beginning of the Advent season; that season when we long for and prepare for the birth of Jesus. This year the theme we'll hear in worship is: "Fear Not: From Fear to Joy."

This theme is inspired by two things.

The angel's refrain "fear not" which is spoken again and again in the stories leading up to Jesus' birth. The angels appear to Zechariah, Mary, Joseph and the shepherds in the field to invite them into God's plan. Each time the angels appear, they bring a greeting of peace so that they would not be afraid. This angelic refrain is a contrast to King Herod's own fear when he learns about the "newborn King."

This year marks the 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the hymn "Joy to the World." Written by Isaac Watts in 1719, the hymn is based on Psalm 98 and looks forward to Christ's coming again. It is thought to be the most widely printed hymn (at least according to Wikipedia!) and is widely regarded as a favorite Christmas carol. Perhaps you're humming it now just thinking about it!

In the very first verse, "Joy to the World" proclaims Christ's coming and invites us into it, saying: "Let every heart prepare Him room." Normally, I sing right through it, but I began to wonder what it looks like to make more room in our hearts for Christ to come; for joy to flourish. What if we heard this, not only on Christmas Eve but in the weeks leading up to Jesus' birth? How might our waiting and watching of this Advent season be different with that invitation out front: Let every heart prepare Him room.

At the same time, the angels' "fear not" refrain echoes in my mind. Why is this the refrain that is repeated again and again throughout the whole story; from prophecy to fulfillment? The good news comes only after a word of peace to dispel the fear. I began to wonder if God knows how much room fear can take up in our hearts. Maybe entrusting those fears that live within us to the Light of God's love is how we make more room for Christ to come into our hearts. And so, this Advent theme was born: Fear Not: From Fear to Joy.

I hope you'll join us throughout this season as we journey together and anticipate the birth of Christ. May we all make more room for the good news to enter into our hearts where joy can abound!
